## ***DECEMBER 2017***

*“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”*

John 1:1 NRS

It's the beginning of the Christmas story according to the Gospel of John. Now I know it may not sound like the Christmas story. There is none of the familiar imagery of Matthew or Luke: no shepherds, no wisemen, no journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, no innkeeper or angels or any of those things. Instead we have the glory of God, existing before time began, creating all that exists, and journeying from heaven to earth to show God's love to all people. This was important to John, that the Word that became flesh was truly human and truly God, Jesus. The child that was born to a poor peasant woman, wrapped in strips of cloth, and laid in a manger, was the same great "I AM," the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. We don't understand how this could be, if God somehow limited his own power in order to be human, if Jesus was totally omnipotent and all powerful from the time he was a baby, or if he grew into his dominions as he got older. There are stories about Jesus that seem to indicate that he had great power, even as a child, but these are just historical traditions and not found in our scriptures. The only picture we get of Jesus as a child is the report about him being in the Temple when he was 12 years old and astounding the priests with his knowledge and wisdom.

It's easier and simpler to look at the accounts from Matthew and Luke and think of the cute little baby, born in a manger, who would grow up to save the world. But this same child was already God, in the flesh, having given up the glory of heaven in order to help us better understand how much God loves us. That's the wonder of Christmas. That's the joy of celebrating a baby's birth that we sometimes gloss over with sentimentality. May you celebrate the joy of Christmas this year knowing how much God loves you, on Christmas morn and throughout the whole year!

It used to be the day after Thanksgiving when department stores would let loose with the Christmas carols and decorations. Now you can find them the day after Labor Day. And some stores operate with Christmas themes on a year-round basis. All of this can make us insensitive to the wonder and glory of the season. Come out to this year's Quiet Service and take a single hour to help you slow down from the hectic pace of the season and truly prepare your heart for the wonder of waiting, watching, and hoping for the day the birth of the Christ child will again be celebrated. There is no liturgy, no standing up and sitting down, no requirement to do anything but sit, listen to the music and the readings, and enjoy the visual presentation that will help to focus your mind in preparation for Jesus' birth. And then go forth in peace, with your heart prepared for the season. This year's Quiet Service will be held on Sunday, December 3, at 7:00 pm. Please plan to come out and prepare your heart for this wondrous season.

# MEANING OF SYMBOLS OF CHRISTMAS

**STAR** – is the heavenly sign of divine promises made. God promised a Savior for the world, and the star was the sign of the fulfilment of God’s promise.

**ANGELS** – are God’s heavenly messengers who heralded the glorious news of our Savior’s birth. The angels sang: “Glory to God in the Highest, on earth peace and good will toward all people.”

**BELL** – Just as lost sheep are found by the sound of a bell, so may the Christmas bell bring all humankind into God’s fold. The bell symbolizes guidance and return.

**CANDLE** – symbolizes that Christ is the Light of the World, the light that no darkness can overcome. When we see candlelight, we are reminded of Christ who forever displaces the darkness of our lives and of our world.

**FIR TREE** – remains green (the color of life) all year round, symbolizing the everlasting hope of all humanity that is found in Christ. All the needles point upward, depicting our thoughts and prayers always rising toward heaven.

**WREATH** – represents the true nature of God’s love. It has no beginning or end; it continues forever.

**HOLLY** – reminds us of the price paid for our salvation leading to Eternal Life. The leaves symbolize the crown of thorns worn by our Savior and the berries symbolize the drops of blood shed on our behalf.

**GIFTS** – God so loved the world the he gave his son. Thanks be to God for his unspeakable gifts. The wise men bowed before the holy child in Bethlehem’s stable and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Like wisemen of old, we seek Christ in our lives and offer our gifts in service to God and one another.
