“When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.” Acts 2:1-2

June 4th this year is Pentecost Sunday, the day when we remember the gift of the Holy Spirit coming to the disciples and setting them on fire to proclaim the good news of the gospel to all the people in Jerusalem and the whole world. The disciples longed for the gift of the Holy Spirit. They couldn't wait to receive this gift from on high, not knowing what form it would take or how it would affect them, but simply trusting in Jesus' promise that it would lead and guide them and be with them constantly in the days ahead. When it arrived on that Pentecost day, they boldly proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah and Savior of the world in every language imaginable.

We too have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit. When we are baptized, we claim the promise of the Holy Spirit's work in our lives as we make the sign of the cross on the head of the newly baptized, sealing them with the Holy Spirit and marking them with the cross of Christ forever. And like those first disciples, we too are unsure what form the Holy Spirit will take in our lives, how it will affect the path we take, how the gifts of the Spirit will enable us to serve God and others. So we, too, must simply trust in Jesus' promise that the Spirit will lead and guide us and be our constant companion. I think we forget sometimes that we are never alone. We make our way through life occasionally oblivious to the fact that the Spirit is trying to guide us down a path. Maybe it's because it's somewhere we don't really want to go, or because it's not what we think we should be doing. But when we are open to the leading of the Spirit, our lives can follow exciting and fruitful routes that allow us to make full use of the gifts that the Spirit gives us so that, through our very lives, the message of the Gospel continues to be heard.

SECOND SUNDAY

FOOD BANK DONATIONS
